

WHAT IS N2NCU?

NATION-2-NATION CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY (N2NCU) is an online, video-based center for education and training to provide training for pastors and Christian workers around the world. It includes Biblical training, ministry training, and community development training.

Our N2NCU teachers are accomplished, educated leaders from multiple nations, who have had their most important courses filmed in the Nation-2-Nation film studios. Many of our teachers are bishops of entire countries or geographical regions. They are all evangelical and Spirit-filled.

Our community development curriculum is taught by professional doctors, dentists, agriculturalists, veterinarians, etc. They are established leaders in their respective fields and have served in developing countries throughout their careers.

We currently offer an associate and B.A. in biblical studies and ministry. We also offer a combined program culminating in an associate's and B.A. in community outreach development. Descriptions and video clips for many of our courses can be viewed online at: www.winministries.org/store.

Our team is constantly filming and developing new courses to add to the curriculum.

Our aim is to help train the eighty percent or more of Christian workers around the world who for various reasons are limited in their ability to attend a traditional, residential training school. We desire to empower churches to become centers of ministry training and community development training and outreach. We are continually at work translating our curriculum into the most widely used languages throughout the world.

N2NCU is a branch of World Impact Now (WIN) Ministries (Inc. 2005) and is currently involved in leadership training in countries around the world through the use of their own curriculum (the Nation-2-Nation Curriculum) and through a partnership that allows them to use the International School of Ministry (ISOM) curriculum.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

ACCREDITATION

Nation -2- Nation Christian University (N2NCU) is a subsidiary of WIN Ministries, Harlingen, Texas.

"Accreditation is a process by which an institution evaluates its educational activities, in whole or in part, and seeks an independent judgment to confirm that it achieves its mission and goals and is generally equal in quality to comparable institutions or specialized units." (ABHE.org)



Our N2NCU professors are accomplished and well-educated leaders from multiple nations, who have had their most important teachings filmed in the Nation-2-Nation film studios. Many of our professors are bishops of entire countries or geographical regions. Most hold doctoral or master's degrees. Our community development instructors are Christian professionals, doctors, dentists, veterinarians and agriculturalists.

As a result, the N2NCU curriculum is undergirded by strong academic standards. It is designed to enable the student to reach his or her highest potential in ministering the Gospel of Jesus Christ to His church and to non-Christians. Accreditation is an external evaluation of our peers, which is intended to verify that we, as an educational institution, are appropriately meeting or exceeding our stated educational goals and objectives. Accreditation ensures that a school is offering a quality program.

N2NCU offers a Biblical education, granting degrees in biblical studies and ministry (of the Gospel of Jesus Christ). Therefore, the peers of N2NCU are Cchristian organizations and associations of christian educators. Nation-2-Nation Christian University does not offer degrees in non-religious vocations.

N2NCU is accredited with Christian Accreditation International and Ethnos Accrediting Association. Both are private Christian accrediting commissions.

Nation-2-Nation Christian University is also a certified member of the Academic Council for Educational Accountability.

Our degrees are not meant to prepare people for secular employment, instead they are religious degrees that prepare students for service in ministry. These degrees are for ministry and might not be accepted by secular employers for jobs. It is also unlikely that institutions that hold recognized government accreditation will accept the credits for transfer.

However, various Christian universities and seminaries throughout the United States of America may accept transfer students, credits, and degrees from N2NCU. These may include institutions such as:

LEGAL STATEMENT

Degree program(s) of study offered by Nation-2-Nation Christian University have been declared exempt from the requirements for licensure under provisions of "Religious Exemption" found in Texas Education Code, Section 132.002(a)(2) as regulated by the Texas Workforce Commission. Exemption from licensure is not based upon any assessment of program quality under established licensing standards.

All degrees of Nation-2-Nation Christian University are of an

ecclesiastical nature and, whether granted or conferred, are in the restricted area of religion with the special purpose of preparing persons to work in the area of religion, whether educational or ministerial; they are not designed to be used in general academic circles.

In some states in the United States, non-government accredited degrees may not be used for job advancement or on resumes, business cards, job applications and letterheads. These states include (but are not necessarily limited to), Alabama, Nevada, New Jersey, Oregon, Washington, and North Dakota.

Transferability of credits earned at Nation-2-Nation Christian University and transferred to another institution is at the discretion of the receiving institution. The degree programs of this seminary are designed solely for religious vocations.

N2NCU is not accredited by a U.S. Department of Education-approved accrediting agency nor is it accredited by a government-recognized accrediting agency. Government accreditation is not required for the religious vocations in which we train.

APPLICABILITY

Nation-2-Nation Christian University provides students with an education designed to prepare them for the work of Christian ministry.

Students will find that our courses are very applicable in their work and their lives as they respond to the call which God has for them. Thousands of students around the world and in the United States have used N2NCU to prepare them to enter ministry or for promotion into positions of ministry and leadership in churches and church denominations.

The desire of the board, staff, and faculty of N2NCU is to equip each Christian, church, and church denomination for the call and purpose that God has for them.

ACCESS TO COURSE MATERIALS

Online students using the Web Courses are required to enter a username and password to login to take course exams.

The top of every page specifies whether a person has successfully established their identity to use the computer system or conclude its use. Visit www.n2ncu.org/login or click on the text specified as "Login" or "Logoff" found on every page.

A username can be recovered by submitting the e-mail address account associated with the account. Click on "Forgotten your username or password?" found just below the login field on the Log In page (online/n2ncu.org).

The student must know the e-mail address of their student account.

Course Materials are available after enrollment.

Students having trouble logging into the system should contact the Site Administrator at admin@n2ncu.org.

STUDENT PROFILE

The Student Profile is a basic view of the student that may include country, ministry experience and course profile. The student may also upload a picture if they wish.

The Student profile is created upon registration. You may edit its contents by going to My profile settings, Edit profile as seen in the image above.

COURSE SYLLABUS

Each Course has a Course Syllabus. It is recommended that the student review the Course Syllabus and refer to it when wishing to see those activities for which grades are given. The Course Syllabus tells you what to expect in the coming weeks. It gives information about the instructor and course is about and highlights the Course Objective. The Course Syllabus informs you of coming topics and assignments. It also gives you guidelines on how each activity is graded.

Please review the course syllabus for important information.

THE STUDENT NOTES

The Student Notes is one of the core activities for each course. The student notes are in PDF and/or a web format and can be viewed with the video lesson. Students in the degree program may print the student notes for reference. The student notes are a required activity and must be viewed in their entirety for each session.

THE VIDEO LESSON

Each Lesson Lesson has three core-required activities:

THE VIDEO LESSON

The Video Lesson is the core of every lesson plan. The video lesson consists of the lesson for each session of each course and is taught by one of our many learned, active pastors, missionaries, bishops or doctors. The student is required to view every video lesson in the course sessions in its entirety.

THE SCRIPTURE ASSIGNMENT

Each course session is given a Scripture Assignment. The Scripture Assignment is presented in the Lesson Plan. The student is required to complete the Scripture (Reading) Assignment for each session.

THE QUIZ

Each session contains a quiz. The quiz is a true/false and/or multiplechoice activity reviewing the Video Lesson and Student Notes. The quiz will prepare the student for the final exam. The quiz is graded and must be completed by the student.

DISCUSSION GROUPS

Each session consists of three to four Discussion Groups. Because Nation-2-Nation is designed to function without teacher or administrator interaction and requires little to no writing, it is absolutely essential that the student complete the Discussion Group assignment. We encourage each student to go above and beyond the required number of posts and be as ambitious in answering the forum question as the student is able.

In addition to these activities, sessions may have additional readings, scripture memorizations or journaling activities.

TESTIMONY REQUIREMENTS

- How has this course helped you to help others? For example, how has it opened up areas of ministry, encouraged you in evangelizing, given you more faith to practice your gifts in the Holy Spirit? Helped you to love your wife, your congregation, or your neighbor? Think in these terms and share your testimony with us.
- If you are an overseer, pastor, evangelist or anyone involved in active ministry, please share any meaningful testimony of how the N2NCU training has changed or helped your life or ministry.

PRACTICAL MINISTRY REQUIREMENTS

Practical Ministry is a requirement of Nation-2-Nation University. N2NCU requires that each student complete no less than two (2) hours of Christian service per CREDIT hour for each semester of course work. This works out to a minimum of 20 hours of ministry in a typical semester.

Practical Ministry is defined as the following activities:

- Evangelism/Preaching/Teaching
- Youth/Children Ministry
- Worship Ministry/Prayer/Intercession
- Community Outreach
- Practical Help (i.e. cleaning, repairs, building, set up, project participation)
- Pastoral (i.e. visitation, grief counseling, etc.)

In each session the student will find:

- Practical Ministry Instructions (read)
- Practical Ministry Questionnaire (Graded Activity)

Twice per course the student will find:

• Practical Ministry Survey (required)

HOW TO BE A SUCCESSFUL STUDENT

What makes a successful Nation-2-Nation Online Student?



HOW TO BE A SUCCESSFUL STUDENT

THE GENERAL RULES

SELF-MOTIVATION AND SELF-DISCIPLINE

Success in online courses requires commitment and discipline. Because you will not be sitting in a classroom on a regular basis, you must be self-directed and conscientious about completing assignments. Good time management is an important factor in your success as an online student.

WILLINGNESS TO CONTRIBUTE

Student of N2NCU should be willing to share their views in the forum discussions.

EXPECTATIONS FOR THE COURSE

Nation-2-Nation is designed to offer fully automated Lesson Plans assessable to people at varying levels of English literacy. We are unable to offer teacher support or interaction as a result we have made every effort to design the course in an easy-to-use-and-understand format with little-to-no writing required.

COMPUTER SKILLS

You should have a working knowledge of the following computer skills to be successful in an online environment:

- The ability to use Internet browsers Examples: Internet Explorer, Mozilla Firefox, and/or Google Chrome
- A basic understanding of navigating websites.
- The ability to use email (and to create a new email address if necessary)
- A knowledge of where to find technical support for issues outside of Nation-2-Nation, i.e. computer, software or Internet problems.

CONFIDENCE IN ONLINE LEARNING

Online courses are not for everyone. If you feel that face-to-face interaction is always needed for learning, you may not feel comfortable in the online classroom.

COMMITMENT

Online learning requires your commitment. Committing yourself to completing your video session and the rest of the lesson plan in a timely manner is essential to the learning process.

ONCE YOU START

LEARNING SPACE

Find learning space that is free from distractions. You might consider your office, a public library, or a separate room at home.

SYLLABUS

Check each session to view your syllabus. The syllabus contains all the information you need to progress through a course, including the course description, objectives, course requirements, assignments and testing, uses of media and technology, and contact information.

COURSE DESIGN

When reading the syllabus, familiarize yourself with the course design to see if you can be a successful learner in that specific content area.

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

Before your course begins, make sure you have a computer with adequate hard disk space, as well as an Internet connection.

TIME MANAGEMENT

Set aside sufficient time in your personal schedule to do the work of the course.

- Set up and stick to a study schedule.
- Set goals and deadlines for yourself.

Set interim (short-term) goals and deadlines for yourself.

Without reminders from other students and a classroom instructor, it is easy to fall behind. Procrastination may put you too far behind to

successfully complete the course.

STUDY SCHEDULE

Identify a study time for yourself when you are fresh, attentive, and free of distraction. Think of the study time as "reserved time" and stick to it regularly. If you miss too many study times, you should change your schedule.

STAY IN TOUCH

Log on to your course Web site often (preferably at least once a day) for e-mails, discussion topics, and school announcements. Find out who has commented on your postings, and read the feedback of other students. If you do not log on to your course discussion group often, you will fall behind.

ASSIGNMENTS

Your courses will have different forms of assignments. Make every effort to complete the additional assignments offered, memorize scriptures, recordin the journal assignment, seek practical ministry opportunities, and study all the scriptural readings. Take notes while you are completing the readings and watching the videos.

PARTICIPATION

Make sure that you are actively participating in the course. The student is required to post on group discussions. Students must participate in the various lesson discussions available.

Initiate discussions whenever possible, always contribute your ideas and comments on the subject you are studying, and read about those of your classmates. You can gain great insight from your classmates, and they can learn from you as well.

SEEK ASSISTANCE

If you find yourself in need of help with your lessons, seek out a friend or acquaintance help you understand your course material or help you study for an exam.

ATTITUDE

Take your studies seriously and yield yourself to the work of God in you throughout the course sessions.

YOUR PROGRESS

During the semester, re-read the course objectives and standards

often to see how you are progressing with them. If you think you are falling behind, then adjust your study schedule accordingly.

TESTS/QUIZZES

Before you take a test/quiz, make sure you understand the information covered in the course assignments that will be the basis for a assessment. Review your results and learn from your mistakes.

APPLICATION

Try to apply and use what you learn in your online course as you learn it so that you will remember it more easily later. Attempt to make connections between what you learn and what you do. Real-world application helps you internalize what you learn. Your classmates may also benefit from hearing about your real-world experiences.

COMPUTER OR INTERNET PROBLEMS

Because Nation-2-Nation Christian University is designed to be fully automated, we are unable to provide a Help Desk for computer or Internet problems. It will greatly benefit the student to have someone in mind, a friend or relative, that could assist if they are experiencing computer-related problems.

However, if there is a technical problem specific to the school website such as a broken link, a study lesson that will not progress or similar problems directly related to the school website, the student can submit a trouble ticket. The student may submit a ticket at the Help Desk on the site pages.

ENGLISH

If English is not your first language, building your English language skills will be an important part of your education with Nation-2-Nation Christian University. To help assist those who need to improve their English speaking and reading skills, we offer a link to The English Club. PERSONAL AND SERVICE CONDUCT

AWARENESS POLICY

It is the personal responsibility of each student to be aware of the policies and procedures in the Nation-2-Nation Christian University Student Handbook.

PERSONAL CODE OF CONDUCT

Each student is expected to behave in an ethical, lawful, like Christ toward others and in the conduct of their work, family and ministry life.

PRACTICAL MINISTRY

All diploma/degree students are required to perform practical ministry as a part of their Christian education.

EDUCATIONAL CONDUCT

Cheating: Students must do their own work and must not receive help from others on a quizzes or exams.

Plagiarism: Do not use or copy another person's writings without crediting that person. Do not present words, writings or answers as your own which in fact are not your own but have been taken from someone else.

GROUP DISCUSSION CONDUCT

- Your posts should reflect polite, well-mannered behavior. You are welcome to disagree with another student's ideas but not to "attack" the other person with your posts. Students are not allowed to use inappropriate language on posts (including swearing or obscene language).
- Content should be directly related to assignments and course work.
- No advertising of churches or businesses is allowed.
- There should not be discussions about the benefits of a particular denomination or church group.

ACADEMIC RESPONSIBILITY

Each student has an academic responsibility to:

- Enroll and commit oneself to an educational goal
- Complete each educational goal within a reasonably and timely manner
- Complete all requirements of each course to the best of the student's ability
- Seek help in reaching academic goals when necessary

FEES AND TUITION POLICY

What you need to know about payment policies:

- Payments are accepted through PayPal.
- Payments are accepted by month via our N2NCU subscription service.
- Payments for individual classes are not accepted.

PAYMENT HISTORY

The student may check their payment within the Student Profile.

INACTIVE STUDENTS/SUSPENSION

A paying student on the degree path will be considered suspended after one (1) year of inactivity from the date the student was enrolled in the most recent class. For instance, if a degree student is enrolled into Free by Divine Decree on September 1, 2013 but ceases course activity six sessions into the Free by Divine Decree course on September 29, 2013, the student will be placed into a suspended status one year after the date that the student was enrolled in the course. Students who enter a suspended status.

- Must create a new subscription account.
- Resume with no loss in grades or class credit*.
- Lose all current work in the semester in which they became inactive and must begin again.

*Students who have been absent for four years or more lose all credits and must start from the beginning

The student in the degree program will be required to maintain a grade average of 60% or higher.

In addition, traditional degree program students are accountable to the costs associated with the degree program. Degree costs must be reconciled with N2NCU in full before the desired degree is awarded.

REQUIREMENTS FOR A DEGREE

- 1. Student must be officially enrolled in the degree program.
- 2. Completion of the Nation 2 Nation Christian Universities core courses with a grade of 60% or higher.
- 3. Successfully accrued 72 credit hours toward an associate degree or 144 credit hours toward a bachelor degree.
- 4. Completion of the "practical" ministry hourly requirements
- 5. Submission of a personal testimony as it pertains to the student's time with N2NCU.
- 6. Submission of all fees, grades and degree requests to Nation 2 Nation Christian University.

*Credit hours may differ according to curriculum offered in various parts of the world. Local students transitioning to online curriculum may accrue slightly different credit hours. Degree requests are available on the Student Resources page.



GRADUATION POLICY

Students wishing to graduate will have completed all of the Requirements for a Degree as listed in the Student Policy Handbook. Requirements for a Degree can also be found under FAQs, on the site pages.

Students wishing to graduate must have paid all fees pertaining to the student's educational tract. Eligible students will be notified upon logging into their student profile that their degree is ready and will be prompted to request the delivery of the degree. Having met all requirements and having requested his or her degree, the student will then have the degree mailed/posted on their student page within 60–90 days.

TRANSFER OF CREDITS

N2N's course credits are currently accepted by Covenant Theological Seminary (www.covenanttheological.net) and can be applied toward a master degree in any one of their seven ministry specialties.

ASSESSMENT

FAILURE OF EXAMINATIONS

- Students are given two opportunities to pass the course exam.
- If a student has failed the exam but has completed all of the course activities well, the student should have enough points to pass the course.
- If the student has failed to complete 100% of the course activities and failed the exam, the student will have to re-take the course in its entirety.
- If a student fails a course, they are allowed to attempt the course two more times. If they fail the course all three times, they will be placed on academic suspension.

ACADEMIC SUSPENSION

- If the Student has failed the same course three times, the student will be placed on academic suspension.
- The student will take a leave of absence for a minimum of six months to further develop language skills and study disciplines. After six months the student may re-apply and, if able to pass an evaluation, will be fully re-instated. Any credits earned prior to the student's leave of absence will be active.

STUDENT RECORDS

Your grades and completed courses will be safe with N2NCU indefinitely. Your profile and progress will never be deleted but may be deactivated if you have been gone for an extended period of time. 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BILLING

BILLING CYCLE

These companies which service N2NCU are also fully obligated to protect your information.

OTHER PARTIES

It may be necessary, by force of law, legal process, litigation, and/ or requests from governmental authorities within or outside your country of residence, for us to disclose your personal information to meet our own legal obligations. WIN Ministries may also disclose information about you if we deem it necessary to protect our mission, our reputation, our users, staff, or volunteers, or if we have reasonable suspicion of illegal activity.

In the event of a transfer, merger, or sale of the site and/or WIN Ministries, we may transfer any and all personal information to the relevant third party.

PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

WIN Ministries and N2NCU take reasonable precautions, including administrative, technical, and physical measures to safeguard your personal information against theft and misuse, as well as against unauthorized access or disclosure.

CHILDREN

No information may be submitted to the site by users 13 years old and younger. It is difficult to identify under-aged users, and we will not be responsible for anyone misrepresenting their age as over thirteen years when in fact they are not.

UPDATES OR AMENDMENTS TO THIS OR OTHER N2NCU POLICIES

We reserve the right, at its sole discretion, to update, change, amend, or remove portions or all of any policy, including this privacy policy, at any time, without notification.
